Winston Hills Bears | Development Squad Parent's Code of Conduct.

- + To support and encourage your child and their team by understanding the goals and expectations of our Youth Development Framework and assist them to achieve those expectations.
- + To encourage your child to maintain all personal items in good condition and to arrive at training and game day on time and in the appropriate attire.
- + Act as a positive role model and behave in a responsible and dignified manner. Positive support and encouragement of your child and their team is encouraged.
- + Abuse or criticism directed at referees is not acceptable and will not be tolerated.
- + There will be no negative criticism or involvement in arguments with the opposition. Opposing players and their officials will be treated with respect.
- + Parents are not to instruct their child on how to play during games as this may interfere with instructions that have been given by the coach.
- + Development Squads will train twice per week prior to and during the football season, usually on Tuesdays and Thursdays. Your child's coach/manager will advise you of timing and location (which may vary during the season subject to the availability of fields).
- + You must notify the coach/team manager if your child is unable to attend training or game day. Always presume training is on, unless you have been notified by email or SMS otherwise.
- + It is a requirement that your child has a nominated parent/carer present throughout all training session and matches in order to provide care and assistance as required.
- + All team members are expected to be available for all training sessions, trial games and matches. You must advise the coach/manager in writing, of any extended period which your child shall be absent from regular training and matches.
- + The coach is not to be interrupted during training or while a match is being played. Any queries or concerns should be directed to the coach after training has finished.
- + Injured players must notify the coach and manager. The player will only be allowed to return with the appropriate clearance.
- + You will be required to assist at the Winston Hills Bears with canteen and BBQ duties and from time to time with set up and pack up of the fields depending on the game times. These duties will be shared by all parents and are a compulsory obligation.
- + Failure to comply with these rules could result in removal from the Development Squad and assigned to a regular team of an appropriate standard.

- + Players are required to attend all training sessions and games, unless there are legitimate reasons, e.g. sickness, school work, family concerns.
- + The coach must be notified as early as possible if the player cannot attend.
- + If a player is injured they are still required to attend training sessions and games and assist the coach with drills or setting up.
- + Players must attend all training sessions in correct and presentable attire. Certain equipment and attire will be provided by the club and the coach/manager will advise all players and parents as to expectations in this regard at the start of pre-season training.
- + On arrival to training sessions/games, players are required to greet the coach, fellow players, parents and anyone else associated with the team/club.
- + At no stage are the players allowed to approach or speak to the referee during a game unless they have the coach’s approval (e.g. in the case of the team captain). If players breach expectation they will be put on the bench for the remainder of the game without exception.
- + Players will be required to play in different positions and game time will vary week to week.
- + Players are to arrive at the pre-determined time before a games and training session. If the player is running late the coach must be notified as early as possible via SMS. In cases of persistent lateness players game time may be restricted.
- + Players should keep in mind that the objectives of the Youth Development Framework are aimed at progressing the player’s football development. The coach’s decisions will be made around this philosophy players are therefore asked to give their full commitment to the directives of the coach.
- + Failure to comply with these expectations could result in removal from the Development Squad and assignment to a regular team of an appropriate standard.
